This bill creates a Microenterprise Development Organization Grant Program and Advisory Committee to be administered by DED. It also creates a River Enhancement Community Attraction and Tourism Fund (RECAT) fund. The bill extends the Community Attraction and Tourism fund (CAT), makes modifications to Individual Development Accounts (IDA), and appropriates money for a Low Head Dam and Water trails Study to be done by DNR. The bill appropriates \$2,875,000 from the interest off the Federal Economic Stimulus and Jobs Holding Fund.

SENATE PASSAGE:

The Senate **PASSED** Senate File 2430 on April 23, 2008 by a 48-0 vote.

ESTBLISHING THE COUNCIL ON HOMELESSNESS
Ranking Member: Representative Granzow

The bill codifies the 38 member Council on Homelessness that has already been meeting under the organization and supervision of the Iowa Finance Authority. This bill give the Council the strength of law to continue looking at the causes and solutions for homelessness in Iowa.

SENATE PASSAGE:

H-8472 by Senate: This is a Senate strike after amendment that establishes a system for the Department of Economic Development to protect certain information during the application and contract process as well as the period after contract closeout. The information in the application is kept confidential during the initial review process, but can be released to a third party for technical assistance. The Department will review written requests for confidentiality when an explanation about why the information is confidential is included. The Dept. can release the non-confidential details to the public and will provide notice when information is requested but is kept confidential. If a request is denied, the entity can withdraw the application and no information will be released. DED shall adopt rules to address these concerns including:

- Impact competition in certain industry sectors
- Possible adverse financial impact on applicants
- Company's possible relocation to another state

Senate File 2325 By Committee on Economic Growth
CHANGES TO THE PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Ranking Member: Representative Wienczek

The bill made changes to the Physical Infrastructure Program which provides aid to projects on brownfield sites or doing refurbishing of a building. The bill eliminates the initial job and wage requirements under the values fund so that businesses have more initial start up funding and can meet job and wage requirements at a later time.

SENATE PASSAGE:

The Senate **PASSED** Senate File 2325 on April 8, 2008 by a vote of 49-0.

HOUSE ACTION:

Consideration of Senate File 2325:

Amendments:

H-8368 by Thomas: This amendment merely makes a correction to a date to correctly identify reporting periods.

H-8383 to H-8368 by Drake: This precludes certain employers from receiving economic development assistance funds when they choose not to utilize the Federal Employment Eligibility Program as authorized by the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Act. This restriction includes any programs utilizing tax assistance, grants, bonding, loans, enterprise zones, financing, subsidies, abatements and discounts.

DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS BILL
Ranking Member: Representative Hoffman

This is the DED Programs bill which makes administrative changes to DED. The bill allows the Department’s director to appoint a designee to a DED Board meeting. It caps the film tax credit program to only a maximum of 25% of the projects total expenditures. It also streamlines the reporting process for a number of programs into a single, consolidated annual report to the Governor and Legislature. The bill also allows the DED to contract on a case by case basis for commercialization issues and spend recaptured money on recommended improvements.

HOUSE ACTION:

Consideration of House File 2450:

Amendments:

H-8081 by Thomas: Adds requirements to the Targeted Small Business Program annual reporting. It requires that a summary of the report be given annually to the Departments of Inspections and Appeals and the Dept. of Administrative Services. The report must contain a summary of the number of loans, loan guarantees, and grants given out as part of the Targeted Small Business program the previous fiscal year. **H-8081** was **ADOPTED** on a voice vote.

H-8086 by Tymeson: Makes restrictions on the DED financial support of projects utilizing eminent domain. This changes the definition of “public use” to preclude those projects that receive financial incentives, so that eminent domain cannot be used for the project.

H-8086 was rule **NOT GERMANE**. Representative Tymeson **MOVED** to suspend the rules to consider Amendment H-8086. The motion to suspend the rules **FAILED** on a record roll call vote of 44-50 with:
