**Senate File 505 by Committee on Judiciary**  
**PROTECTING FROM CIVIL LIABILITY FOR USE OF A DEFIBRILLATOR**  
**Ranking Member: Representative Struyk**

This bill insulates individuals who provide assistance during an emergency. The bill does not allow an individual to be sued for using, attempting to use, or failing to use a defibrillator during an emergency situation. It extends the protections of Iowa's Good Samaritan laws.

**SENATE PASSAGE:**

The Senate **PASSED** Senate File 505 on March 19, 2007 by a vote of 47-0.

**HOUSE ACTION:**

**Consideration of Senate File 505:**

**Amendments:**

**H-1581 by Committee on Judiciary:** Clarifies that the legal protections only extend to circumstances arising out of the use of an external defibrillator. **H-1581** was **WITHDRAWN**.

**H-8121 by Committee on Judiciary:** Clarifies that the legal protections extend to situations where an external defibrillator is being used. It also clarifies that legal protections only apply when the business has maintained the defibrillator in working condition according to the Dept. of Public Health Standards. **H-8121** was **ADOPTED** on a voice vote.

The Act creates guidelines for nonprofits and other entities as to the management and use of their endowments and funds. It also gives donors power to enforce the intent of their donations.

The bill limits the court to only entering a temporary modification order dealing with custody or physical care rather than a permanent change. This keeps parents from being negatively impacted because of their military service.
